(Lights, just west of the Bridge over Duffins Creek, and East of Rosebank Drive) Take the first Road on the east side south of Taunton (also called Old Whites Road or even Forestream Trail) and we'll meet in the parking lot about 100 meters after you see the bridge.

The Seaton Trail has some hills to climb as we hike, so be prepared. Please dress according to the weather and consider wearing sturdy footwear. Hiking poles, if you have them, would be helpful to some. You may wish to bring a camera to

capture some impressive views of Duffins valley and its high clay, riverbanks. I look forward to seeing you!
